LOT CREATION APPLICATION – CONSENT & SUBDIVISION

Planning applications for created lots by consent or subdivision, require comments from the Department of Public Health and Emergency Services to assist the County in its decision on your application. This form will determine if specific comments are required from the Board of Health and if so, the appropriate fee must be submitted with your application (based on the Board of Health's User Fee Schedule for 1998).

SECTION A – WHERE SEPTIC SYSTEMS CURRENTLY EXIST OR ARE PROPOSED

- 1. Does the new property have less than 4,047 sq m (1 acre) Yes No
- 2. I am uncertain of the location of the existing septic tank and the tile bed on the property. Yes No
- 3. There will be more than one dwelling unit on each new lot. Yes No
- 4. An industrial, commercial, agricultural or institutional use is proposed which will require a septic system. Yes No
- 5. Is the property within 183 meters (600 feet) of an abattoir (slaughter house)? Yes No
