



- Update urban design policy directions into the Official Plan




Draft Goals

Draft Goals


- 4. Create **vibrant places** by supporting a **mix of uses** where appropriate

Draft Goals

- 7. Preserve farmland and other natural resources
- 8. Ensure **positive transitions**between different land uses as
 well as urban and rural areas
- 9. Focus on **public health** by creating accessible, walkable and complete communities
- 10. Support a variety of transportation choices with a priority on pedestrians



Policy Overview & Implementation


- Official Plan provides overarching goals for entire community

Policy Overview & Implementation


Potential Study Outcomes

- 5. Identify implementation timelines and other considerations







- Promote community improvement programs
- Beautify the rear facades of main street buildings and explore redevelopment opportunities
- Build on the strengths of the large inventory of heritage properties
- Ensure context-sensitive and sustainable renovations, additions, and developments
- Define and protect the unique character our each area




Existing and New Communities

- Organize new communities to prioritize active forms of transportation
- Provide a healthy mix of housing options suitable for all ages, incomes and lifestyles
- Create a sense of community identity through the design of new buildings, streets, parks and open spaces
- Prioritize sustainable community design
- Design residential buildings to address the street and to encourage a safe and vibrant pedestrian environment




Rural Areas and Agricultural Uses


- Build on the strengths of valuable agricultural resources
- Protect agricultural uses from outward urban expansion
- Encourage agri-tourism and other agriculturally related business opportunities
- Support sustainable farming practices and ensure the protection of existing natural features
- Protect rural heritage elements



Commercial Uses

- Improve the relationship between buildings and the street
- Improve streetscape conditions and create clear circulation paths for pedestrians
- Encourage multi-storey commercial buildings
- Emphasize the visual prominence of building entrances
- Improve landscaping and signage
- Follow sustainability best practices for site design and construction





Employment Uses

- Respect the historic significance of existing downtown employment buildings and better integrate them with their surroundings
- Ensure that buildings address adjacent streets
- Explore opportunities for appropriate screening
- Provide an appropriate interface between employment buildings and sensitive land uses
- Follow sustainability best practices for site design and construction including access to transit and support alternate modes of transportation



Institutional Uses

- Build on the strengths of existing institutional uses, and encourage their expansion
- Consider the adaptive reuse of vacant institutional buildings
- Direct new institutional uses to existing serviced areas
- Design major institutional buildings to be of the highest standards



Streets

- Design urban streets to support active transportation and to incorporate furnishings and landscaping
- Design rural streets to reflect the surrounding context while meeting the transportation needs of the County
- New communities should be constructed with an inter-connected grid of streets




Parks, Open Space and Natural Areas

- Expand upon existing natural features through the integration of parks and open spaces
- Ensure that parks and open spaces are placed and sized appropriately
- Encourage an appropriate balance of active and passive recreational uses
- Protect natural heritage areas and ensure sustainable uses



Cultural Heritage

- Preserve heritage assets within existing communities
- Respect the original historic character and preserve original fabric where appropriate
- Discourage the alteration of any historic architectural or landscape features
- Adaptive reuse should be considered as part of the conservation and restoration of heritage buildings
